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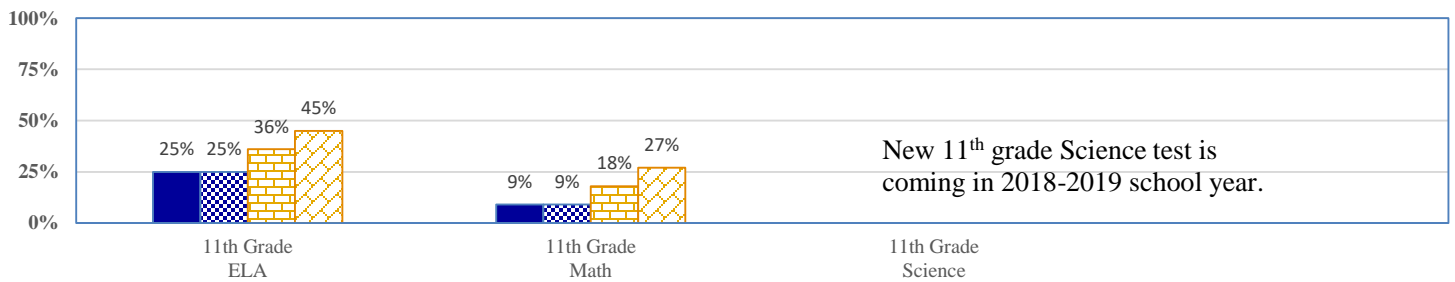

New 11<sup>th</sup> grade Science test is coming in 2018-2019 school year.

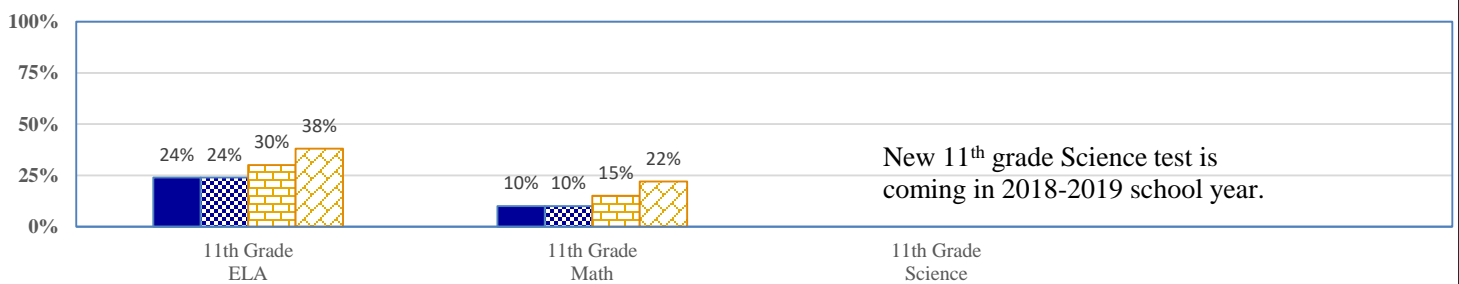
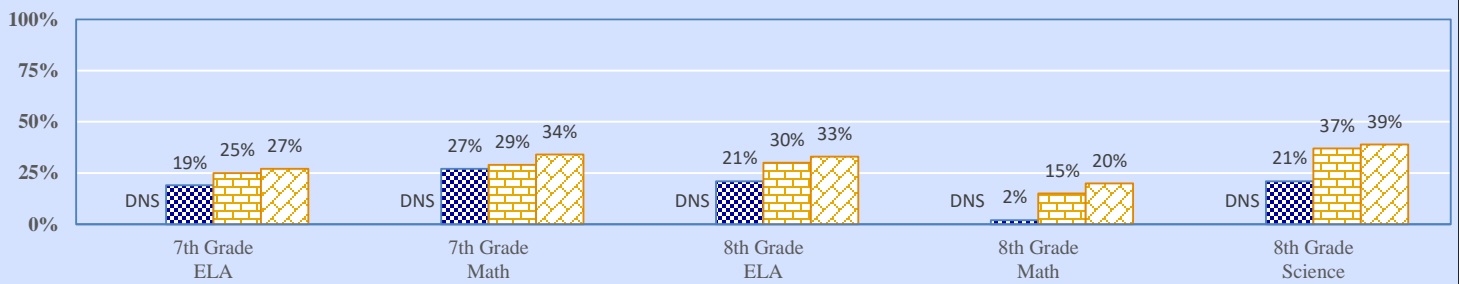
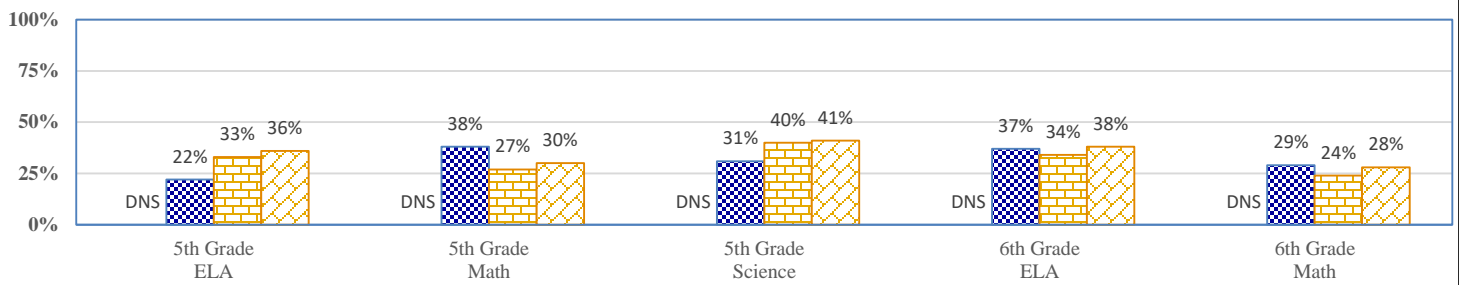
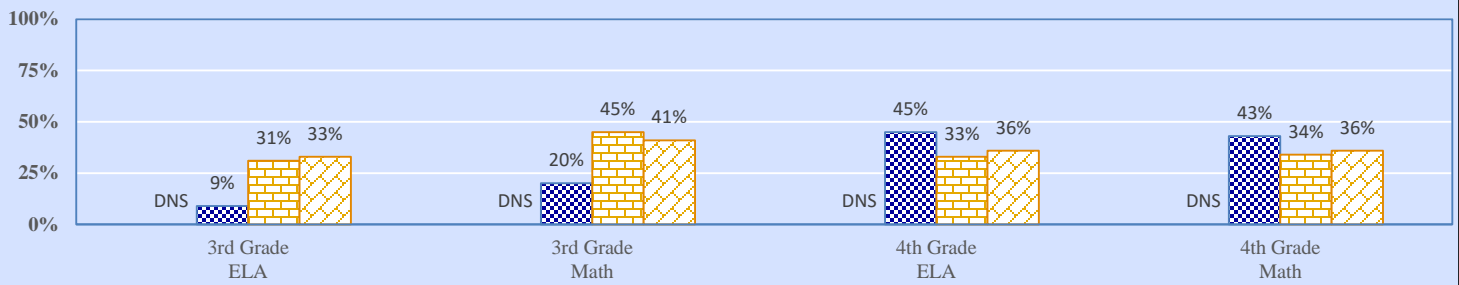
