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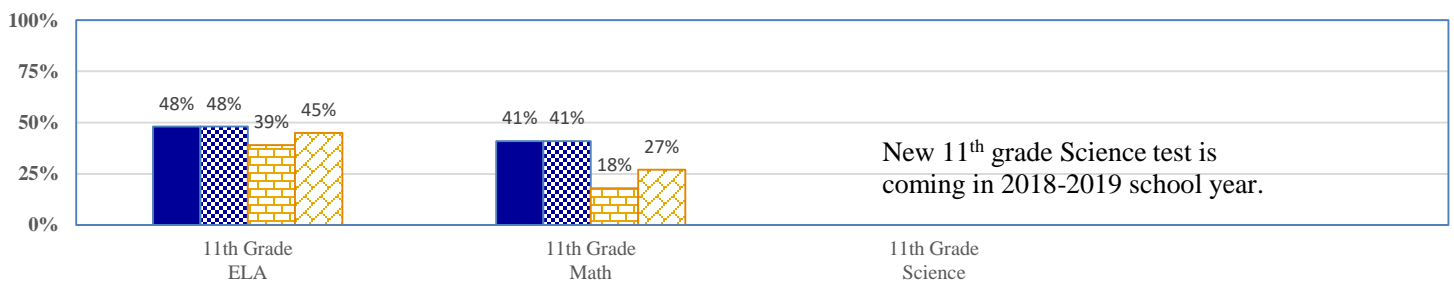
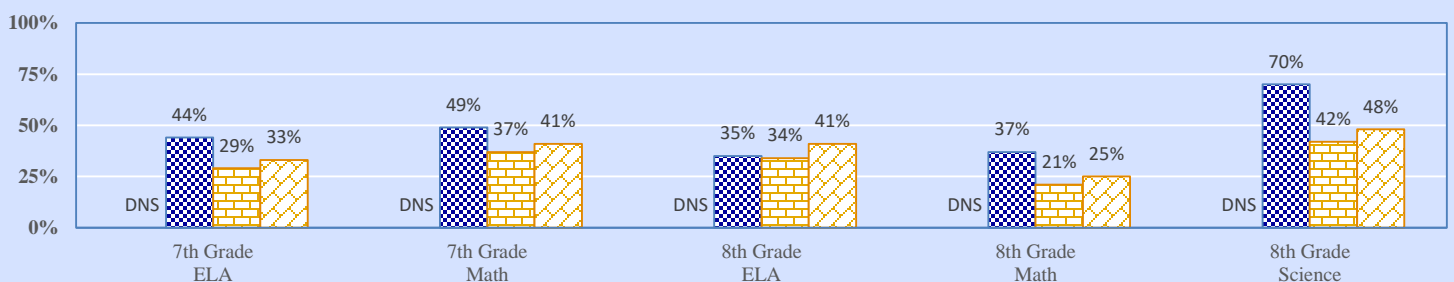
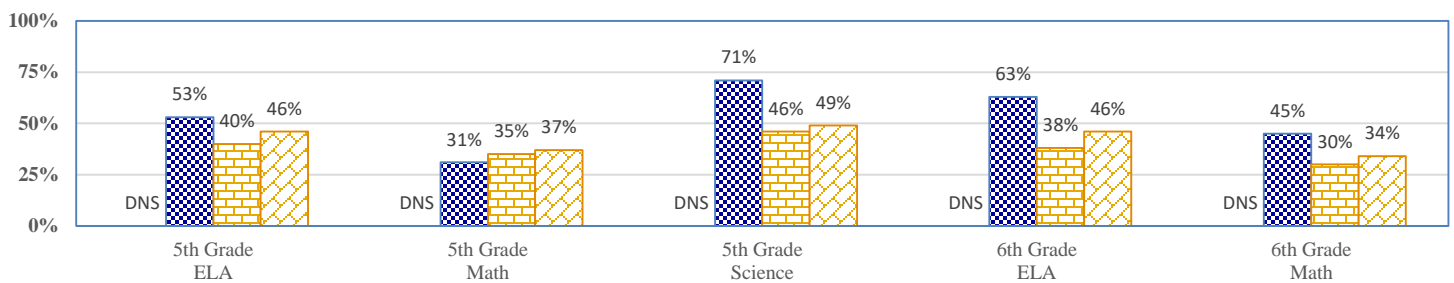
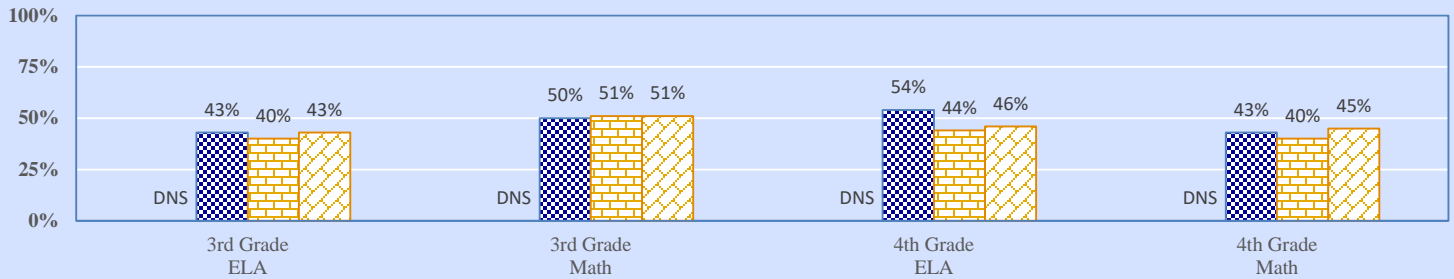
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2017-18 Student Performance (Regular Education Students, Full Academic Year at This Site)

% of Students Scoring Proficient and Above by Grade and Subject

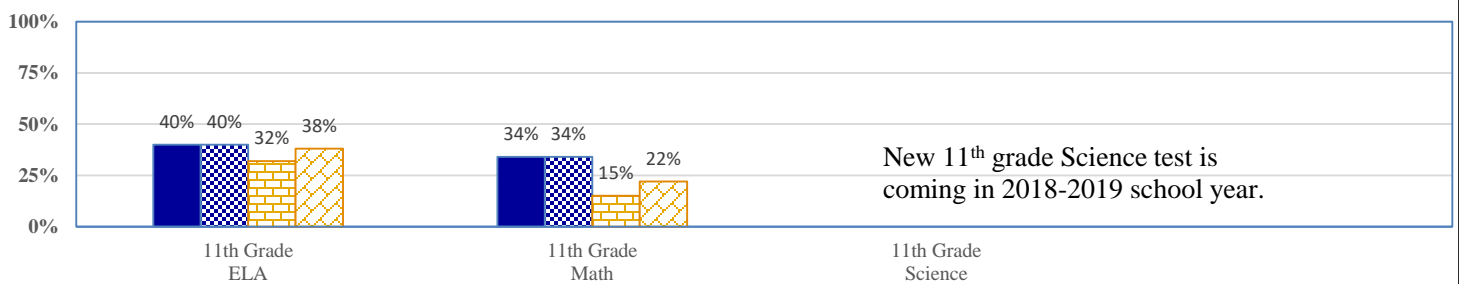
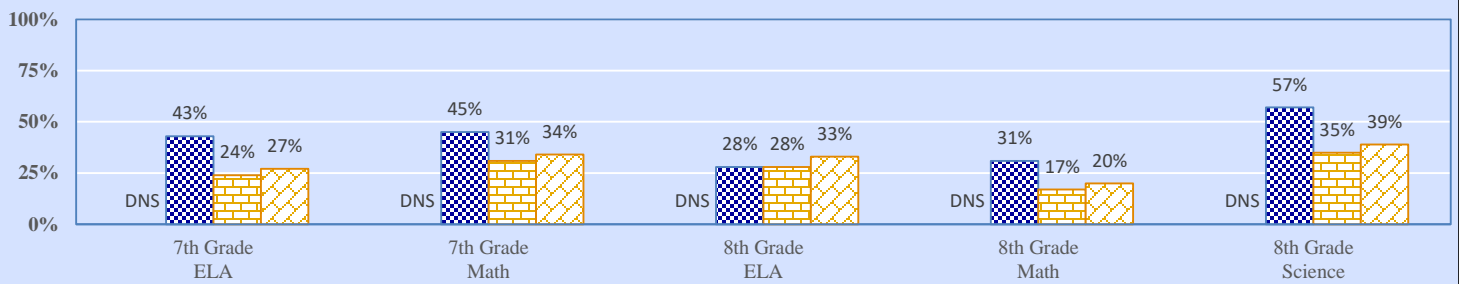
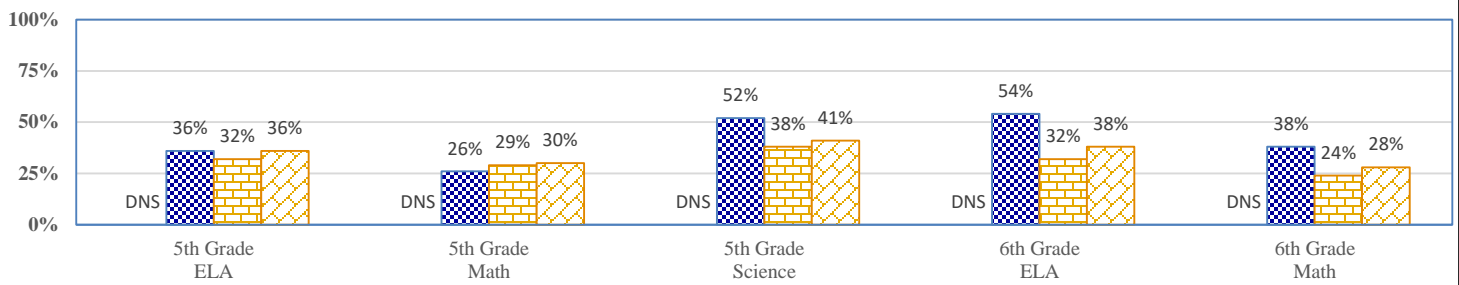
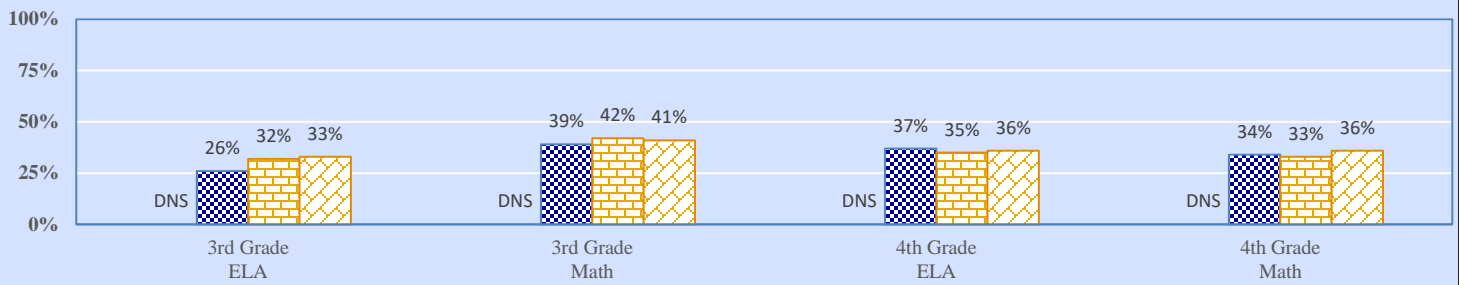
